Math:

This week we will begin Eureka $Math^2$ curriculum. We will represent data to solve problems using picture and bar graphs.

We will be practicing procedures for Daily 3 Math. Daily 3 is a framework for structuring math time so students develop lifelong habits of math fluency, problem solving, writing and working independently. Students select from three authentic math choices, while the teacher meets individual needs through whole-group and small-group instruction. These choices include:

- Math By Myself
- Math with Someone
- Math Writing

Language Arts:

We are beginning our Second-Grade classroom language arts program, Benchmark, with Daily 5 this week. Daily 5 is a framework for structuring literacy time so students develop lifelong habits of reading, writing and working independently. Students select from five authentic reading and writing choices throughout the week, working independently toward personalized goals, while the teacher meets individual needs through whole-group and small-group instruction, as well as one-on-one conferring. These choices include:

- Read to Self
- Work on Writing
- Read to Someone
- Listen to Reading
- Word Work

Homework: The students brought home the "Read All About Me" poster last Wednesday. Since there is no math homework this week, I encourage the students to work on the poster. Be creative! The poster is due no later than next Friday, September 8th.

Things to Remember:

- Please continue to check your child's communicator (yellow folder) nightly and initial that you've read the daily message.
- Please make sure your child(ren) brings a water bottle to school every day. The students may keep them at their seats.
